

Public Invited to Police Building Groundbreaking Ceremony on March 12

Although work has begun, a ceremonial groundbreaking will be held on March 12, on the property of the new Creve Coeur Police Department Building. The ceremony is open to the public.

The 30-minute ceremony will begin at 5 p.m., outside on the north side of the Government Center parking lot at 300 N. New Ballas Rd.

Mayor Barry Glantz and Chief Glenn Eidman are scheduled to speak before elected officials and dignitaries turn some ceremonial soil.

In January, United Construction was awarded the construction contract and the site has already been cleared in preparation. The 25,000 square-foot, two-story building will be the new home of the Police Department which is currently housed in the Government Center. The \$10.69 million bond project should be completed by March 2019. During construction, public parking at the Government Center will be limited.

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Election Signs: Understanding Proper Usage

In addition to signs that are allowed during the rest of the year, temporary election signs and other non-commercial signs are allowed during election seasons. These additional temporary signs are regulated by the city's zoning ordinance to ensure pedestrian and vehicular safety are not hindered due to sign placement.

Regulations include:

- Signs are not permitted within the public right-of-way. The right-of-way is typically 10 to 15 feet back from the curb.
- If a sidewalk is present, signs must be placed on the property side (signs may not be placed between the sidewalk and roadway).
- Signs may be posted starting 45 days before the election.
- Signs must be removed no later than 10 days after the election.

- Signs are only permitted with the property owner's permission.
- Signs may be single- or double-faced, but no sign face may exceed six square feet on residential property or 12 square feet on commercial property.
- The number of additional signs per lot may not exceed the number of candidates or propositions on the ballot.
- Signs may not be attached to utility poles.
- When placing an election sign, do not block access or visibility of pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

Description: A text amendment application has been filed by George Stock of Stock and Associates Consulting Engineers, Inc., on behalf of Payne Family Homes, to amend Table A, Permitted and Conditional Uses within the GC-District, to allow attached townhomes and multi-family dwellings as conditional uses within the GC-General Commercial district and providing standards for these uses within Section 405.470 Conditional Uses of the Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council is hosting a public hearing on Monday, April 9, 7:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers for the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for fiscal years 2019-2023.

The city updates its 5-year CIP every year. The CIP includes projects such as construction of sidewalks, installation of park amenities, street resurfacing and improvements to the stormwater system. Funding for projects comes from the city's half-cent capital improvement sales tax, grants, and transfers from the general fund. The CIP process includes: 1) input from residents, elected and appointed officials and city staff; 2) preparation of the draft CIP by city staff; 3) review of the CIP by the Planning & Zoning Commission and Finance Committee; 4) a public hearing; and 5) final adoption by the City Council.

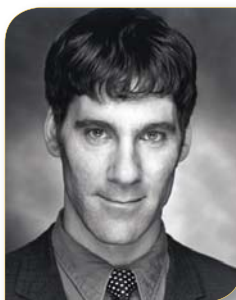

Limb & Leaf Collection

Limb Collection Program begins Monday, March 12. As in past years, city crews will continuously cycle the city collecting limbs between 0.5 inches and 3 inches in diameter and more than 3 feet long. Limbs less than 3 feet long will not be collected. Chipping crews are limited to 15 minutes per residence pickup in order to serve all residents in a timely manner. Collection continues through mid-October.

Leaf Collection begins the week of April 2. The schedule is as follows:

Leaves and Limbs should be placed by the curb by 7:00 a.m. on Monday of the scheduled pickup week to guarantee collection. Leaves and limbs will not be collected from the street or from common ground.
